APCC is doing everything we can to flatten the curve. This means protecting our clients and our employees from

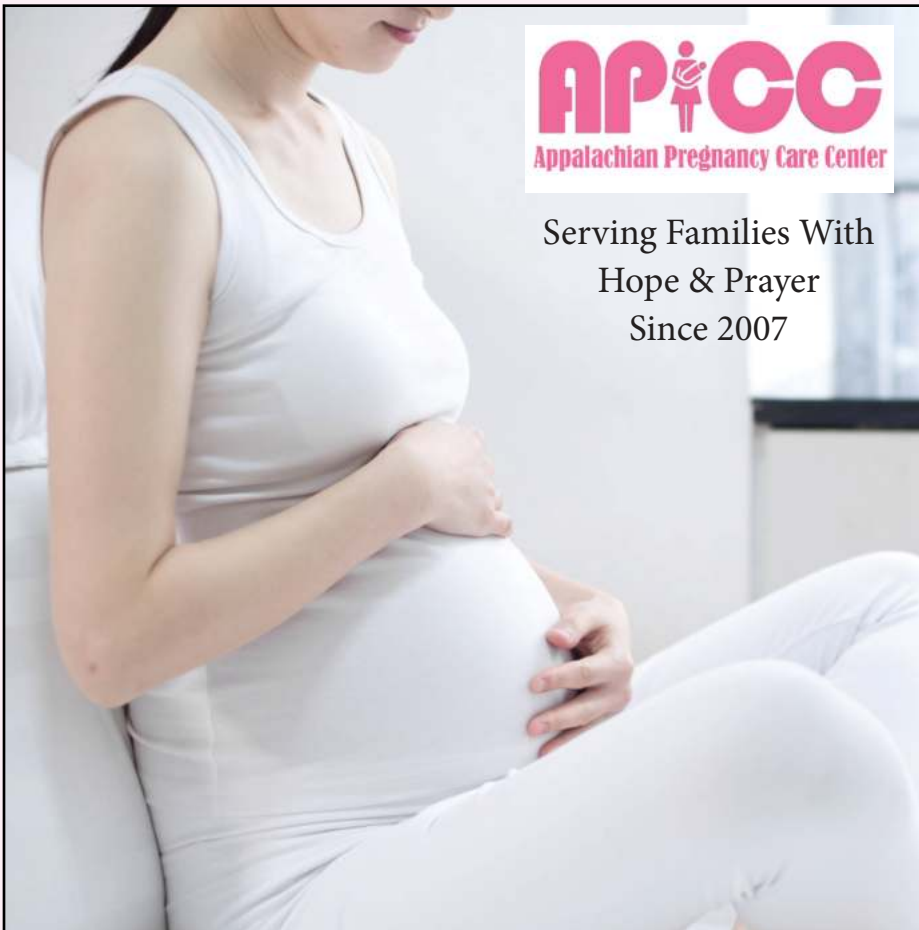
the virus so we all stay healthy.
